



Resolution Guide for Hermosillo Model United Nations (HMUN)

The ultimate goal of the conference is for the delegates to present written solutions that resolve the issues discussed in their committee, resulting in a resolution. Based on the discussion, the Delegates should arrive at resolutions that will timely settle the conflict scheduled in their Committee. As specified in the form of Rules and Procedures of Hermosillo Model United Nations, Chapter IV Resolutions, in Article 14.

Resolution Fundamentals

1. A resolution is a document that contains all the issues that the Committee wants to resolve and the solutions proposed for them. It is called a resolution because that is what the United Nations calls the documents it produces. Technically, the resolution should be called a Draft Resolution before it is put to a vote, and a Resolution after it has been successfully adopted by a vote in the body.
2. Any Delegate within a Committee may write a resolution. The author or authors of a resolution are called sponsors.
3. Resolutions shall be written during the conference, after a motion for adjournment of the meeting, Article 17.6 of the Rules and Procedures.
4. The Draft Resolutions and the Resolutions contain:
 - a) Header
 - i. Name of the committee.
 - ii. Sponsors.
 - iii. Signatories.
 - iv. Topic.
 - b) Preamble phrases
 - c) Operative phrases
5. All speeches, discussions, negotiations and teamwork should lead to a resolution containing all proposed solutions to the problem. To adopt a Draft Resolution the following regulatory protocol must be followed:
 - a) Once the draft is completed, it should be submitted to the Conference Secretariat for review.
 - b) After its revision, the Bureau will inform the Delegates that the project is ready for their consideration, for which it will be necessary to call the motion for *Consideration of a resolution*.



- c) Finally, the debate on the resolution in question shall be closed by the motion for *Closure of the debate on the resolution* and the relevant vote.
6. Resolutions on which the majority of the Committee agrees will be adopted during the vote and the sponsors will be commended informally for building consensus on good ideas (through applause). Multiple resolutions may be adopted provided they do not contradict each other.
