

Dress Code for Hermosillo Model United Nations (HMUN)

Introduction

In order to realize a high level Model United Nations and based on the diplomatic work done at the United Nations, the Hermosillo Model United Nations (HMUN) Executive Committee has agreed to create this Dress Code to be followed by the participants of the conference.

In accordance with Chapter 2.- Composition of Committees, Commissions and Councils, Article 4.1; of Rules and Procedures of Hermosillo Model United Nations (HMUN), all Delegates, as well as the staff of the STAFF and Executive Committee, shall be required to wear Western business attire.

Dressing professionally is an important point, which every Delegate should take care of, when joining a Model United Nations (MUN). Dressing appropriately is an important way to show respect for the nation being represented, for all delegates participating, and for the United Nations itself, which we are all representing at the time.

¿What is a western business attire?

Western business attire, also known as universal standard business clothing, is used in elegant and formal work offices. This type of clothing requires the use of a flux, avocado or tailored suit, which consists of pants or skirt, a jacket or blazer, a buttoned shirt or blouse and, in the case of gentlemen, a tie.

Dress shoes are conservative and socks are very important. Skirts and dresses, which do not go together as a tailor, can also be used, as long as they are a maximum of two fingers above the knee.

Sensuality and exhibitionism should be totally avoided, as well as any detail that diverts attention from the event to the person himself. All types of clothing should be so discreet that they do not draw attention to themselves.

Chapter I.- Dressing and supervision

Article 1.- Dress must be Western business attire, and every delegate must wear it during the conference.

Article 2.- In order to ensure compliance with this code, members of the Sub-Secretariat General for Administration shall be responsible for carrying out supervision.

Chapter II.- Penalties for failure to comply with the Dress Code

Article 3.- In the event that any Delegate fails to comply with the Dress Code, he will be reprimanded with the respective sanctions at the discretion of the corresponding Executive Bureau.

Chapter III.- Clothing for both sexes

Article 4.- It is forbidden to wear any jeans (capri type, tube type, denim, leggings or shorts).

Article 5.- It is forbidden to wear sandals (sport shoes, ballerina type shoes, crocs and any resemblance to these).

Article 6.- The use of T-shirts, chemises, strap tops or sleeveless blouses is prohibited.

Article 7.- Briefcases, bags or backpacks must be of classic and serious style. Not in bright colors, fluorescent or with children's designs. In case you do not have a suitable briefcase at hand, it is preferable not to carry one.

Article 8.- The hairstyle must be classic, keeping the face always uncovered.

Article 9.- Hands must be extremely clean and well cared for, with nails of an elegant and acceptable length.

Chapter IV.- Women's clothing

Article 10.- The formal dress of the woman shall be composed by:

- a) Long, straight and formal pants.
- b) Skirt (2 fingers above the knee).
- c) Serious and discreet dress.



- d) Dress shoes of loafer type or medium heel (neutral color).
- e) Collared shirt.

Article 11.- With the purpose of maintaining the formality of female dress, the use of some garments will be prohibited:

- a) Cocktail dress.
- b) Party dress.
- c) Short skirts.

Article 12.- It is acceptable to use simple, discreet and neutral tones in the make-up used during the conference.

Chapter V.- Dressing

Article 13.- The formal dress of the man shall be composed by:

- a) Suit.
- b) Tie.
- c) Collared shirt.
- d) Belt.
- e) Dress shoes.

Article 14.- In order to maintain the formality of men's clothing, there is a list of allowed colors for suits:

- a) Black.
- b) Navy Blue.
- c) Grey.
- d) Beige.

Article 15.- With the purpose of maintaining the formality of men's clothing, there is a list of prohibited colors for suits:

- a) Metallic.
- b) Phosphorescent.
- c) Any other color not included in Article 15 of this Chapter.
